1. These Directions are made under Section 37 and Schedule 3 Paragraph 2 (4) (f) of the Human Tissue Act 2004 (HT Act) in order to set out the licence fee structure of the Human Tissue Authority (HTA) for the financial years 2006/07 and 2007/08.
2. The HTA's licence fee structure is set out below and comprises such sums in respect of its costs in connection with superintending compliance with the terms of licences for the purposes of Schedule 3 Paragraph 2 (4) (f) of the HT Act.

## 2006/07 – Licence Fee Structure

<b>Sector</b>	<b>Annual payment</b>
Anatomy (and related activities)	£6,000
Pathology (post mortem and related activities)	£6,000
Public display	£6,000
Existing, permanent small museums or collections holding fewer than 20 exhibits of relevant material.	£500
Research	£6,000
Satellites (all sectors).	£250
Establishments storing tissue for human application	£4,500 (see table below for payments in first financial year)

### Establishments storing tissue for human application 2006/07


<b>Criteria</b>	<b>Annual payment</b>
Establishments without current accreditation by MHRA	£4,500
Establishments accredited by MHRA and inspected before 31 March 2005	£2,250 (first year only)
Establishments accredited by MHRA and inspected before 31 March 2006	£750 (first year only)

## 2007/08 – Licence Fee Structure

<b>Sector</b>	<b>Main site</b>	<b>Satellite</b>
Research	£5,200 pa	£800 pa
Public Display  – Existing, permanent small museums or collections holding fewer than 20 exhibits of relevant material.	£3,600 pa  £250.00	£500 pa
Pathology	£5,300 pa	£2,100 pa
Anatomy	£5,200 pa	£700 pa
Establishments storing tissue for human application	£7,600 pa	£1,000 pa
Establishments procuring, processing, testing, importing and exporting tissue for human application where no storage licence or third party agreement (following the coming into force of the Human Tissue (Quality and Safety for Human Application) Regulations 2007)	£7,600 pa	£1,000 pa

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## EXPLANATORY NOTE

Schedule 3 Paragraph 2 (4) (f) of the Human Tissue Act, 2004, provides as follows:

“ 2 (4) It shall be a condition of a licence -

(f) that there shall be paid to the Authority at such times as may be specified in directions sums of such amount as may be so specified in respect of its costs in connection with superintending compliance with the terms of licences.”
